
WISHFUL THINKING

The Stewardship campaign for 2023 reveals God's continuing to grow hearts here at EUMC

We grew from 2022's giving estimate of \$391,796 to 2023's giving estimate of \$413,250 – an increase of \$21,454. Thankful for all the gifts each of you bring in so many ways to accomplish the ministries that God's purposed for this church.

The Finance Team met in late October and we're reaching out because we need help from you to finish 2022 with a positive position in the General Fund account. Each month, in our newsletter, the monthly and year-to-date actual giving received is stated and the 'goal'. The goal represents what it **actually costs** EUMC to operate the General Fund for the year. We anticipate our spending this year will exceed 2022's giving by \$20,900.

We read in Matthew 5:41 where Jesus encourages His followers to live by a different standard and go the second mile when needed. 2nd Mile Generosity means not only doing what is expected (going the first mile) but also doing more than what is expected.

The 2023 stewardship campaign resulted in 68 'giving units'. If we divided the need of \$20,900 among these 'giving units'; and then, if each unit provided a one-time gift of \$307 for 2022 – we could cover this projected deficit.

Our prayer: Dear Lord, help us to serve others joyfully. You have given us so much! We often take your gifts for granted. Help us show our love and our appreciation for you and for others in our lives by going the second mile. The Gospel is the catalyst for our greatest generosity. **In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen**
