#### LEVEL UP

Some of you may remember a time when you were in school and recently returned from summer break. The teacher gives you a simple writing topic to dust off the cobwebs of learning entitled 'What I Did for My Summer Vacation'. I couldn't help but think about this writing assignment as I prepared this month's newsletter article. As many of you know, I missed a Sunday in November to travel to a continuing education conference in Pittsburgh, PA called Level Up. There was a really cool gaming motif used in its design and the overall goal was to give us tools, skills, and knowledge that will help us to level up our churches and our ministry. I attended three breakout

sessions that taught skills needed to grow our digital presence and use AI (artificial intelligence) as a sounding board to craft sermon series and announcements. See me one on one if you are also curious about these skills, but I recognize that I could write way more than an article on these subjects. Instead, I want to focus on three key themes we wrestled with during our time together. In fact, since it's a whole lot to unpack, we'll make this article part one of a three part series.

The first theme is that church can happen outside of our sanctuary and

Sunday morning worship service. Did you know that around 30-40% of the folks in our community work on Sunday morning? So if the only worship our church has is on Sunday morning, we will always be excluding that 30-40%. Vice versa, if we create new worship experiences out into our communities on the other days of the week, we have the opportunity to reach people that have so frequently been left out. The focus of our conversations were on what we call Fresh Expressions or Missional Communities. The goal of these gatherings is to connect to people, build relationships, and offer them spiritual growth if they are seeking it. They can all look very different. For instance, we learned about dinner

churches which are meals with the community that offer a spiritual reflection during them. Remember, Jesus often taught around a meal. They can also happen at a dog park or in a tattoo parlor. It's important that they begin with listening and being a guest at these places in the community. We're not simply out to make them like the church we are sent from, but to happen naturally as we connect and live into the existing communities.


Consider the question I've asked a few times: "What do you love to do?" Where do you gather during the week for community and support? Are there activities you love to do that have connected you to others? Perhaps it's a book club

or a dog park where you gather for conversation while dogs scurry around and children play. What would it look like to bring a spiritual dynamic to those discussions. We're not talking a sermon series or intense Bible study. Rather a moment of prayer or a simple question like "What spiritual practices support you during a busy week?" That one change could turn a vital moment of community into an extension of our ministry. This month, I want you to ask those questions. What do I love to do? Where to I gather for community during the week? May the Holy Spirit take our

answers and use them like a burning bush moment where we answer a new calling to serve.

There are more important themes to unpack from this wonderful weekend of conferencing. Next month we'll talk about the importance of laity and the need for all of us to be deep listeners in our community. I cannot wait to share these new ideas with you and I'm ready to be surprised with how the Holy Spirit uses these fresh expressions to change our church and our reach into the community.



She gave us lots of information pertaining to women's cardiac health, sign/symptoms for women for HA and CAD and dietary recommendations for good cardiac health. She concluded her presentation with a Q&A time with our members.

#### AUTISM MEETING - EUMC JOINS BAILEY GROUP IN DECEMBER!! Can you help??


We will meet on December 15<sup>th</sup> at EUMC with all families and enjoy a



One of the disciplines that we as Christians practice is giving our gifts of time, talent and tithes. We view this as a vital exercise in our spiritual journey.

If you haven't yet met your giving goal, we urge you to be prayerful in ways you might catch up to your pledge. If you are on target, perhaps you'll consider going the extra mile. Either way, together, I know we can find ways to meet our ministry goals for 2023.





W. B. Bullock represented the residents of Ward 6 on the Rocky Mount City Council for nearly 20 years ending in July 2022.
