CONNECTING ALL PEOPLE TO GOD'S LOVE AS WE GO

One of my toughest tasks is coming up with a title for an article or sermon. I tend to overthink things...a lot. But this time I had the title ready before the article. Why? Because that isn't just a title. That's our new vision statement at Englewood UMC. After a lot of prayerful wrestling, our Vision Team identified what words captured our church's heart for ministry. So that you understand the meaning behind those words, let's talk about where they came from.

We begin with that first part, 'Connecting all people to God's love'. During our conversations, the word we used most is 'relationship'. Relationships and deep friendships are very important to our people. From this key characteristic we highlighted our need for deep connections. There is no doubt that connecting with one another and having a real experience of God in worship and in ministry is very important to Englewood UMC. Another word we value is diversity and so we felt the need to use that word 'all'. It was these conversations that led to 'Connecting all people to God's love'.

'As we go.' In Rachel Gilmore's book *Expanding the Expedition Reach with Missional Communities*, she shared the importance of the great commandment in Matthew's gospel: "Go and make disciples". But she offered an interesting insight. You could also interpret this as "Make disciples as you go." That might seem like a simple shift, but I see a significant change to the call. We still have the call to 'go' to leave our places of comfort to connect others to God's love, but there's also a call to connect others as we go through our daily lives. Suddenly, no place is secular as we are seeking to connect people to God's love at home, at school, where we work, and even the grocery store. Ministry moves from an experience on Sunday morning, to a week-long activity of seeing God and pointing out God's presence to others.

You may remember in my previous newsletter article that I was detailing my experience at the Level Up

conference in Pittsburgh. We discussed the need for us to seek ways for church to happen outside the walls of the sanctuary and in the places we seek fellowship in the community. From dog park church to dinner church, the possibilities are endless. These fresh expressions are an example of connecting all people to God's love as we go. When we expand our vision from traditional church to the community outside our doors, worship and discipleship can begin to look a lot different. But two things are needed for us to be successful: our laity and deep listening.

The vision statement of our church does not only belong to the pastor, the staff, or our committees. This is a vision for all of us, especially our laity, to take part in. If all of us examine ways to connect all people to God's love as we go, imagine the places we can reach and the people that will experience the deep connections and meaningful relationships we at Englewood UMC have to offer. But along with this is a need to be good listeners. Listening and prayer were a big part of our work as a vision team. We want to be guided, not by our desires, but by the will of the Holy Spirit. The same is true as we seek to create fresh new expressions of the church in our community. We're not trying to clone what we do on Sunday morning and place it somewhere else. Rather, we need to seek to know the people of our community, their needs, how they connect to one another, and identify their gifts for ministry in order for worship to emerge naturally.

There is still a lot to wrestle with. The next task for our Vision Team is to work with you, our staff, and our ministry teams to set goals for how we can live into this new vision. Take this vision statement home with you. Pray over it and listen to the Spirit for ways in which you might take part in connecting all people to God's love as you go.

OUTREACH MISSIONS PROJECTS - 2023

The Outreach Committee would like to thank everyone for helping make our 2023 Mission Projects a success. As a congregation working together, we were able to provide love and hope to a lot of people.

We started the year off with our “Souper Bowl of Caring”. We chose to partner With “United Community Ministries” to provide assistance to those families temporarily living in the Bassett Center Shelter and men’s shelter. We raised \$4,112.50 to help with the expense of them staying there and also collected over \$1,000 in food and staple items for their use and in the Soup Kitchen. Our thanks to Barbara Batts, Rod Buckner, and Mike Williams for heading up this project for us.

Second, once again we partnered with Peacemakers of Rocky Mount to provide Toys for their annual Toy Store. We held a “Christmas in July” event to collect the toys. We provided 103 toys, gifts and gift cards for their Christmas event. This gave parents a chance to purchase Christmas gifts for their children at a reduced price so they could have a happy Christmas. Our thanks to Judy Overton and Patsy Lepak for representing our Church at The Toy Store shopping event.

Then, with help from our neighbors at St. Andrews Church, St. Paul Church and The Mill Church, we were able to provide 195 Christmas shoe boxes for the children of Armenia. Just think of all the joy this will provide to those children who have so little. We also provided 84 articles of bedding for the people of Armenia who are experiencing such turmoil in their lives. A special thank you to Mike and Beverly Williams for heading up this project and getting the shoeboxes and bedding delivered to the MERCI Center.

We want to give a special shout out to those who have made the trips to The MERCI Center to work on the Christmas Shoeboxes and packing all the items for shipment over the year – Carolyn Clay, David Earp, Sharon Roth, Steve and Debbie High, Patsy Lepak and Mike and Beverly Williams. And a special Thank-you to our Youth for spending one of their Workday Wednesdays at The MERCI Center working on various projects. In conjunction with The MERCI Center, our congregation purchased items needed and packed 308 health kits to be sent where ever needed. Our thanks to Sharon Roth and Mike and Beverly Williams for overseeing this project for us and Thank You to all those who came to pack. After the packing we enjoyed ice cream and fellowship – thanks to Barbara Batts for getting the goodies together.

We also want to acknowledge the monthly donations to our “Love Cans” for Faith Christian Ministry and The Salvation Army. We continue to deliver about One can per month for each.

In support of our troops, we made a donation of \$500 that was matched to the USO for our Military Men and Women for use with items needed during travel. Thank you to Rod Buckner for making this happen on our behalf.
