## **SOUL PURPOSE - APRIL 2021**

Jane and I have been watching a CNN series on Sunday nights, "Lincoln—Divided We Stand." Narrated by Sterling K. Brown of "*This Is Us*" fame, this 6 part series looks at the remarkable life and unexpected journey of our 16<sup>th</sup> President.

I mention this because April is often referred to as "the cruelest month." It's April when tax returns are due and, as I learned in the series, it was Lincoln who imposed the first federal income tax in 1861 to help fund the Civil War, which began in April that year and ended in April 1865.

Unfortunately, Lincoln's life also ended in April 1865, marking one of the darkest days in America's history.

But, let's take a moment and look at this through a different lens.

Unless you are a glutton for punishment with thoughts of continuing cold weather, there is almost no better time than "April" as you give thought to sitting outside, listening to the birds singing, kids laughing and friends taking walks through the neighborhood.

"The cruelest month"? I don't think so. April brings with it the rebirth of the MLB baseball season as we see fans sporting their NY, LA, or B caps. (For you that don't follow baseball, those letters are the insignias worn by three of the more famous teams in sports.)

April. The Romans knew what they were doing when they named April from the Latin word "aperire," meaning "to open." The opening of flowers, the opening of life and, as I just mentioned, the opening of baseball season are all part of "the cruelest month."

For us, April brings the celebration of Easter. Sure, the Romans may have opened Jesus' wounds, but the joke was on them when his tomb was opened and found empty. It is, after all, the month for openings.

Now, we know Easter doesn't always happen in April. Sometimes Easter is celebrated in March. When holidays bounce around rather than being celebrated the same day each year, we call those "moveable feasts", which means they aren't celebrated on the same day every year. Christians borrowed this from the Hebrew Lunisolar calendar, which therefore occurs on a different date each year. When I was growing up, a moveable feast meant that I was fixing a sandwich at my house but walking across the pasture to my grandparents' house to eat it.

April. April is going to serve as the relaunching of our outdoor worship services at Englewood UMC. It's hard to believe that this is our second Easter that will look different due to the pandemic. All of us are aware of the challenges COVID-19 still presents to the church's schedule.

It's stressful to try and plan another major holiday around the restrictions of COVID. It's stressful to feel like you're missing out on past traditions and making adjustments. But, if we've learned anything this year it's that God's reach isn't limited to just inside of our sanctuary, but we can actually gather for "Sunday" school as a "Monday", "Thursday" or "Zoom" school, and that flexibility is key to making memorable celebrations.

April. I can't wait until we meet again outside on the Bell Tower Lawn for April and May worship services and see and hear God speak to us in the midst of Creation.

Actually, I think we can change the thoughts of April being the "cruelest month" and make it one of great memories for our Englewood family.

# BEGINNING EASTER SUNDAY...AND YES, WE ARE EXCITED...

Our COVID-19 Response Team met recently and decided that for the months of April and May we will explore our worship of God back out on the Bell Tower Lawn. This decision was not made in haste; as with all decisions that have been made by this team over the past year, much thought and prayer went into our process. With so many of our friends and fellow members still feeling a bit uncomfortable about gathering indoors, and with the long anticipated break from the cold winter weather, we'll be worshipping God in the midst of Creation. What better way could there be to celebrate this Spring season together?!

Because of our ability to distance outdoors, we will relax some of our guidelines for worship at these services:

- Please be sure to wear your mask when walking to and from your vehicle to worship or when talking with
  your friends. However, once you're seated, you may remove your mask for our time of worship. This is a
  personal choice for you to make while remembering to "do no harm". We will still wear masks when inside
  the building.
- We ask that you continue to practice social distancing and place your chairs at least six feet away from other seating groups.
- You will not need to register for outdoor worship services, and we will not have a check-in process before worship.
- If we experience inclement weather during any of our Sundays outside, we'll simply retreat indoors and follow protocols as currently in place (wearing masks, socially distanced seating, and temperature checks).
- We will continue to livestream our services to our Facebook page for those who wish to participate from home, and they will be posted to our website (www.englewood-umc.com) later in the day.

We are so excited to see you, and we pray that as we move into summer more of our members will have time to be vaccinated and the jeopardy of meeting together will be even lower. The past five months of offering the opportunity for in-sanctuary worship have been a blessing. We are so fortunate that not a single outbreak from COVID-19 occurred as a result of our being indoors, and that we were still able to connect with our whole church family through online worship.

Let's keep making wise decisions for the broader good of all, and together we'll continue to let Englewood be Englewood and, as always, give the glory and thanks to God.

As in the past, you will receive an e-mail or phone call reminder the week before your scheduled Sunday.




## **EUMC Book Club**


Our theme for April is "Resurrection". Here's what we'll be learning about each week:
