What's the Hope in Resurrection?

Jesus said to her, "Don't hold on to me, for I haven't yet gone up to my Father." John 20:17

I cling to things. WE cling to things. As spring finally arrives and the pollen unleashes its fury, it is time, once again, for a little spring cleaning. Maybe you're in my boat, too. You take a look around the house and ask yourself, "Where has all this junk come from?" And yet, the moment we start to part with some of it, a list of reasons pop up in my head for why this and that needs to stay. "Hey! The boys played with it this one time and now it's always marked as precious." Or, "I know I've

never used this, but the moment I give it away or sell it, I'm sure I'll end up needing it again." We worked for this stuff. We saved for this stuff. We cling to this stuff.

One of the things we sometimes leave out of our Easter messages is the need to let go of things. Yes, the message of Easter is all about that empty tomb and eternal life through


Christ. But it's also about resurrection and NEW life. For that resurrection and new life to happen, we need to be ready to let go. Old ways need to stay buried within the tomb.

We have a constant fear of losing. As membership in churches declines, jobs are lost, and lives uprooted, we fear the change and the loss that comes with it. And yet, as Christians and followers of the Crucified Christ it's in change and loss that our Savior thrives. As weird as it

may sound, failure, defeat, and death are never the end of the story, but a place where we are called to thrive. And so clinging to what we have can never be the end game. You'll recall the Easter message of Jesus to Mary not to hold on to him. She needs to let go. We can't hold on. Because letting go is where God is at work.

What do you need to let go of? Where do you feel God calling you to grow and what is standing in

your way? Maybe it's time to forget fears of past failures. Perhaps the time is now to stop mourning the inevitable change on the horizon, the loss of an old way of life. As we survey the church we love, the building and the people, know that the only way forward is to let go of our ownership. We have to be prepared to say farewell to the way we've always done things or our own vision for the sake of a new vision.



Do not be afraid. How many times do we hear that in scripture? A lot. And why? Because even death could not contain Jesus. As followers of the Risen Christ, death will not contain us, either. So stop clinging! Be prepared to let go, to let things pass on, because it is in that death that the miracle of resurrection takes place.



Women of The Way Circle

The Women of the Way Circle met March 21st in the Fellowship Hall. Sharon Roth gave the devotion "There is No Christ Without the Cross". The context was taken from Matthew 16:13-17; 21-23. This scripture tells us that Christ is the Messiah and that His death was a willing submission for the sake of us all and if you take the cross away from Christ, you strip Him of His mission.

The speaker today was Christian Davenport, EUMC's office administrator. She spoke on her October mission trip to Las Vegas with Englewood Baptist Church. This church has planted two churches in this city

which they support: Favor City Church and Walk Church. As in many cities, homelessness in Las Vegas is a major problem. While in Las Vegas, this group helped feed the homeless, worked with Lovewell Church, worked with Project 150 whose goal is to keep high school students in school, and assisted with inventory at a medical clinic for pregnancy and newborns.

In addition to our circle members, several women of the Lighthouse and their Director were in attendance. The circle continues to support Faith Christian Ministries with food products and The Lighthouse with paper products. Two circle member will be selling dishcloth bunnies at the upcoming Lydia's Sisters' Circle Tea.

On Tuesday even, March 28th, the circle will host a dinner for the ladies of The Lighthouse in the Fellowship Hall.

At the April meeting on April 18th, we will be packing health kits for the MERCI Center and members were asked to bring hand towels, nail clippers, and metal nail files. This Circle meets monthly on the 3rd Tuesday at 10:00 a.m. in the Aldersgate Classroom. All women of the church are invited to join us.

is another wonderful opportunity for this generous congregation to help others who can't help themselves.




2023 FLOWER CALENDAR
