## **SOUL PURPOSE - DECEMBER 2021**

s I contemplated a column for this month's Soul Purpose, I could think of nothing more appropriate to share than Luke's account of the birth narrative of Jesus.

The simplicity in Luke's story is profound as it connects the dots between the Old and New Testaments and begins to reveal God's plan of salvation for us. But even more so, the birth of Jesus, the extraordinary son of God, who entered humanity to save the world, was very ordinary, precisely because he is Emmanuel, God IS with us.

God came to dwell not only with people from 2,000 years ago, but to be a part of us, too. Even the 4 babies being born in this very second; the 256 babies born every minute. God is with us ALL. God took something as ordinary as the specialness of human life and transformed it into holy avenues where grace abounds.

Through Emmanuel, God with us, the ordinary becomes the extraordinary, and is the very place where Jesus' choses to deliver us and set us free.

Before Christmas Eve take a few moments and read the gospel account of the Christmas story. Grab a cup of coffee or a glass of eggnog, sit by a crèche and read Luke's story of the first Noel as you allow God to speak to you in this ordinary experience of life

this ordinary experience of life. Then consider the ways in which God's extraordinary plans are unfolding in you.

"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to

him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found

Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told."

## Women of The Way

On November 16<sup>th</sup>, the Women of the Way Circle met with the Circle of Joy to listen to a program from Coastal Plains Hospital on Behavior Health and Substance Abuse. The speaker was Yolanda Outlaw. Other representatives from the hospital in attendance were Cassie Rogers and Omar

McKnight. This facility has just received a new grant for community initiatives and will be working in Nash and Warren Counties. The speaker discussed the stigma of Behavior Health and held a group discussion on listening and support of others. In the substance abuse arena, she noted that it takes 7-8x for an intervention to take hold. She informed the group that both city and county law enforcement have CIT officers which should be requested on a 911 call for MH issues as these men/women are trained to deescalate situations. She also informed the group of a 988# to be used for BH issues and a 211# to obtain resources in the community.

After the program, we adjourned to separate rooms for the individual circle meetings. The Women of the Way welcomed two new members at this meeting: Judy Mesko and Nancy Johnston. The Bereavement Committee is being reactivated with Barbara Batts in charge. She discussed implementing a steering committee to develop new protocol for bereavement. The steering committee will be open to all church members to assist taking this committee in a new direction to serve our church families.

The Women of the Way continue to support Faith Christian Ministries with food products and The Lighthouse with paper products. Our holiday dinner for the women at the Lighthouse is scheduled for December 7<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. The circle will continue its ongoing sales of dishcloths. Please contact Janice Roberson for a purchase. The RADA Cutlery sales will once again be offered this holiday season and Sue McMillan or Glenda Hortman is to be contacted for orders.

Instead of having a Christmas meal in the Fellowship Hall, it was decided to meet at Olive Garden on December 14th at 11:00 a.m. and have fellowship there.


## Children's Sunday School
