SOUL PURPOSE - FEBRUARY 2021

Pebruary? Already? Seems like we just took down the Christmas decorations and already we're searching store aisles or skimming online for the best deals on Russell Stover Candies, Dolce & Gabbana Garden Eau de Parfum, or we're dialing 1.800.FLOWERS for deals on Black Box Roses. Let's face it...when February strikes, our hearts are hit by a chord reminding us that Valentine's Day is quickly approaching. Valentine's Day featuring Cupid and reminders that love is in the air.

Now, for our purposes, let's consider that word, love. What is love and what does scripture have to say about it?

First, there are three ways of expressing love:

Eros, which refers to physical or sexual love. Think, erotic.

Philos, which is a warm affection or friendship. Think, Philadelphia, City of Brotherly Love. And we have $Agap\bar{e}$ love which is the sacrificial, unconditional love of God. Not that the other forms of love are not important, but $Agap\bar{e}$ love is the highest form of love of all.

It seems that in the English language we don't often speak of the different kinds of love; we simply say, "I love you" whether talking to a friend, neighbor, partner, or spouse. We trivialize the word by such comments as, "I love the cheese biscuits at Oak Level" or "I love spending time in the mountains or at the beach."

Seems to me, the Greeks had a better idea. Rather than lumping things of love all together, they broke it out into the various ways of describing it, making it feel more special.

And that makes sense. The love I feel for family is surely different than the love I felt for my favorite college professor or the love I feel for my chocolate Labrador, not to mention the love I have for M&M's.

Hollywood has ruined us when it comes to love because we all fantasize about romantic love that we actually miss out on other aspects of love that may be more fulfilling.

When it came to *Eros*, or an erotic love, the kind we see featured on the big screen, the Greeks actually feared that kind of love because of the loss of control that is often generated by our heightened emotions.

Surprisingly, many of the Greeks actually saw *Philos* love as the love which is most ideal. Uncomplicated, to love our parents, children, or best friends seems to come without some to the potential emotions Eros or $Agap\bar{e}$ can deliver.

But, Agapē? Man, that's something words can hardly describe. Agapē love is the love inside us that we give freely to others, regardless of our relationship to them. The whole idea of agape love is that we don't need to even have met the other person, but we still want to help them, cooperate with them, or actively offer to them a freedom to love us back without reservation.

According to the Apostle Paul, and who of us would ever think he had this in error:

⁴Love is patient; love is kind. Love isn't envious, doesn't boast, brag, or strut about. There's no arrogance in love; ⁵it's never rude, crude, or indecent—it's not self-absorbed. Love isn't easily upset. Love doesn't tally wrongs ⁶ or celebrate injustice; but truth—yes, truth—is love's delight! ⁷Love puts up with anything and everything that comes along; it trusts, hopes, and endures no matter what. ⁸Love will never become obsolete.

1st Corinthians 13:4-8

So, friends, welcome to February. As you celebrate the month, remember to think of gifts found in the ways to love. It's a pretty powerful thing to give while expecting nothing in return.

2020 **OUTREXCH** SUCCESSES

The Outreach Committee, in spite of the pandemic, continued to work in 2020 to reach out to help those in need in multiple ways. We only had limited in person meetings but we did a lot via email and telephone. While we had to cancel some mission opportunities, there were still multiple opportunities offered to this congregation to participate in ministries outside the church walls.

We offered several ongoing ministries in which YOU were involved.

- Faith Christian Ministries You donated 2 to 3 boxes of food and requested supplies monthly.
- <u>Compassion Café</u> We have 6 teams but had to suspend this mission project due to the pandemic in March.
- <u>Autism Support Group</u> In spite of the pandemic this outreach mission continued to offer support to these families.
- <u>First Contact Ministry</u> Designated persons delivered peanuts and a welcome packet to all new visitors until we were unable to meet in person.
- MERCI Center We worked at this warehouse in Goldsboro until the pandemic shut it down.
- UMW, UMM, and UMYF are also arms of Outreach.

Now let's review the various ministries that this committee planned and YOU supported in 2020.

January	Souper Bowl of Caring (YOU donated enough money that allowed Canines for Service to rescue two dogs WESLEY and TABITHA, purchase needed equipment, and support their training so that they can be given to Veterans who need a support dog) Compassion Café -the Seekers and Wesleyan SS class members provided and served a meal)
February	<u>Souper Bowl of Caring Luncheon</u> (held a luncheon for which the congregation provided the food after church to celebrate our success in rescuing two dogs who will rescue two veterans)
May	We picked up <u>2000# of sweet potatoes</u> at the MERCI Center and with the help of EUMC members, the committee bagged and distributed them to various agencies in Rocky Mount.
July	We picked up <u>1200# of food boxes</u> at the MERCI Center and distributed them to various agencies.
September	In lieu of AGAPE Christmas boxes, YOU donated over \$2500 to Armenia.
October	On two Mondays this month, we picked up 38 boxes of produce and then 45 boxes at the MERCI Center. Each box contained 30.5# of Grade A vegetables (the same as you find in your grocery store), milk, eggs, and cottage cheese. These were distributed to various agencies and 3 EUMC families.
November	We asked you to support 10 children for the <u>ANGEL TREE Ministry</u> and thanks to multiple EUMC Angels and the Koinonia Sunday School class, we provided

support for over 35 children.

As I step down from chair of Outreach, I know **YOU** will continue to support the various missions that will be presented to you in 2021 and beyond because that is what **YOU** do!!

We asked you to support <u>Peacemaker's Christmas Store</u> by donating 50 new unwrapped toys. Again you met the challenge and went beyond by donating around 65 toys.


EUMC Book Club


Our theme for February is "Jesus Teaches and Heals". Here's what we'll be learning about each week:

SOUPER BOWL OF CARING 2021

Well, we kicked off our 6th annual Souper Bowl of Caring on January 10th. On that day you learned that our donations would be given to the Nash County Sheriff's Office to pay for the cost of 3 vests for their new K9 deputies. On January 17th, you were able to meet Sgt. Stan Ricks and K9 Pebbles, and learn from Sgt. Ricks about the work the K9s do.

Wasn't Pebbles awesome? (I think she stole the spotlight from St. Ricks.) Doesn't that make you want to be a part of protecting these wonderful creatures? You also were able to see an actual vest that these dogs wear when out in the field. As I've said in the past, the deputies have their protective gear and their K9 deputies deserve protection as well. These vests are made in the USA with NIJ certified ballistic panels so that they are **certified body armor** and as such cost a bit more than a regular dog vest. The cost of each is \$960. As I write this, we are only I week into this Outreach project and only Sneak has made it out of the end zone. As you read this, there are only one or two weeks left (depends upon when you receive the newsletter). You still have time to donate as the SBC doesn't end until Sunday, February 7th plus EUMC will accept online and mail in/drop off donations throughout that week if you are unable to attend in person. Our Sheriff's Office works tirelessly 24/7 for us, even in these stressful times. We at EUMC are very proud to show our support to the Nash County Sheriff's Office through your donations so that all three K9 officers, Kieser, Maya, and Sneak, will receive a vest with "Gifted by Englewood United Methodist Church" embroidered on it.

We have three ways for you to make donations: 1) On Sunday at church in the Special Offering Envelope, 2) Mail your check to the office or drop it in the box inside the office door; or 3) Online. If you write a check, please make it payable to EUMC and write Souper Bowl of Caring on the memo line and if you donate online, type in Souper Bowl of Caring so Christian will know where the money is designated. Unfortunately, we will have to forgo our luncheon this year due to the pandemic but we can still have fun and support a very worthy organization.
