And if you've ever traveled by air, you know how your patience can be tested by airport waiting. Long lines. Missed flights. Plane maintenance. Lost baggage. Lost crews. Weather delays. Sleeping on airport floors.


But even with all that, I still love to travel. Was my patience tested? You betcha. But, in every circumstance God always seemed to strengthen my perseverance and



#### SOUPER BOWL OF CARING 2022

This year we will assist the Safe Pets Program at My Sister's House. We will raise money to provide shots that the animals need and food needed when they stay there. It costs about \$100 if animals need shots and \$40-\$50 per month to feed a pet. We will raise as much money as we can to assist with these needs. Our goal is \$3,000. Please make your check payable to EUMC and mark Souper Bowl 2022 on the memo line.

My Sister's House began The Safe Pets Program in 2004. Pets are an avenue of abuse, batterers may hurt or kill pets to further hurt their partners. It is so encouraging to someone in an abusive situation that they can bring their pet with them. Pets are often considered as part of the family.

My Sister's House has served Nash and Edgecombe Counties since 1981. They have offices in Nashville and Tarboro to serve both counties. They also have a re-sale store that is free for clients, A Second Season in Benvenue Plaza.

All animals must have documented vaccinations, if that can't be verified or the animals needs vaccines they work with area veterinarians. Crates, leashes, food, and litter boxes are provided as needed. The pet stays in the room with its owner.


The pandemic has created a sharp increase in the need of services for victims of domestic violence. In 2021 My Sister's House sheltered 38% more people than in 2020. The work done by the staff of MSH is made possible by the generous support of our community.
