A DISCIPLINED LIFE



February 14th. Valentine's Day. It's also the day where we turn our focus to confession and repentance as we celebrate Ash Wednesday and begin our Lenten Journey. Nothing says date night like being reminded of your mortality at church!

Fasting is one of the ways we celebrate. Whether it is a regular fast from food or an opportunity to fast from a harmful habit or candy we eat too much of, the goal is to make space for God during the forty days of Lent. Fasting is a Spiritual Discipline, a regular routine that keeps us centered on our Christian formation and God's presence in our midst. These disciplines have the potential to create a rhythm in our daily lives motivated by God's grace and not the daily grind. They're also not reserved for just the season of Lent, but necessary for our discipleship throughout the year.

During this season, we want to give you all an opportunity to experience a variety of spiritual disciplines. Instead of our usual book study or Bible study, Pastor Savanna and I invite you to join us on Monday nights beginning February 19th to wrestle with disciplines you might be familiar with and learn about some new practices that might aid you in your daily life. How can we grow in our prayer life, fasting, meditation, reading of scripture, and other practices by hearing about them, seeing how they've been lived out in other Christian contexts, and even practice them ourselves? The goal isn't just to treat them like a diversion during Lent, but for you to find the practices that work best for you that can be incorporated into your daily rhythm.

This will be a joint study put together by Pastor Savanna and myself and we'll take turns leading them. I pray you'll join us for as many of these sessions as you can as we grow in our discipleship and our ability to share God's love with the communities around us.

Ms. Deck will address concerns over agricultural and urban runoff, wetland protection, and flooding and will also address preventive measures including land conservation projects, resiliency planning, and green stormwater infrastructure.

Following the presentation from Sound Rivers, we will review the financial performance of the peanut production project for 2023, consider a proposed price increase, and consider a proposed budget for 2024.


