SOUL PURPOSE - MARCH 2021

uring Lent we've been addressing our faith practices through a series titled, "Enhancing Our Spiritual Habits." Already we've learned more about prayer and scripture. Now, leading into Easter, we'll add Fasting, Confession, Worship, Silence, and Gratitude to the list of topics. Why, perhaps you've wondered, are our spiritual disciplines so important? And, why now?

Let's get the "why now" out of the way first...

I've mentioned several times how this has been a year of great challenge for us all, clergy and parishioner. Not only have we been faced with a worldwide pandemic and the need to adjust our schedules (and lives) to stay healthy, but we also faced a heated political climate that polarized our nation.

For me, the challenge I faced each week was one of sensitive balance. Knowing I'm appointed in a diverse setting, I lived on edge; I dreaded saying the wrong buzz word or mentioning a topic that bordered on a particular political ideology, fearing I might offend someone. I would never do that intentionally, but I will always attempt to challenge you from the pulpit to live lives that mirror that of Christ and that we love God and love neighbor. My convictions demand that of myself. I don't fear speaking to biblical justice for all people.

It was with that in mind that I thought how interesting in could be to have a refresher on how we might enhance our spiritual disciplines and rededicate ourselves to practicing these habits every day.

Newsflash! We're not perfect. I love the scripture I recently read that said, "My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you . . ." (Gal. 4:19).

Perhaps the pain that has gone with the challenges of the past twelve months might be worth it. <u>Until Christ is formed IN YOU!</u> What a powerful message is wrapped up in that singular verse. Our goal is and always should be to have our lives become more like that of Jesus. Not lives that are tied to any one political ideology, but lives that are found tied securely to our Savior.

Enhancing our spiritual disciplines in a manner that engages us daily allows us to grow closer with God and in becoming conformed to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

It's no secret that I love sports. There is something admirable about how athletes train their bodies to perform at peak level for a game that consists of 60 minutes.

The choices an athlete makes require that they say "no" when they want to eat a Pop Tart, or "no" when someone wants them to hang out at Buffalo Wild Wings 'til 1:00 a.m. Because their sport requires them to improve their skills, athletes workout and properly balance their diet with healthy choices.

To be the best in living our lives as Christians, we too need to train ourselves to be the best we can be. That's why having good habits surrounding our spiritual practices is so vital.

And the timing of this series is important.

As we prepare to move forward with new leadership in Washington, and as we see an exit strategy to the pandemic with schools reopening and life (hopefully) getting back to a more normal pace in the weeks and months ahead, our churches will begin to fill up again. Our programming will begin to look less Zoomie and more fellowship meals and reacquainting ourselves with each other will take place. Music, oh the glorious music will raise the rafters and I'll actually be able to greet you after the service.

It may be after spring / summer before we're totally there but we need to be ready for those days when they come, so we begin to plan now. Let's enhance our practices of our spiritual disciplines so that when the day comes, we will have moved ourselves beyond anything that separates us from the love of Christ and find ourselves strengthened as the Body of Christ.




EUMC Book Club

Englewood United Methodist Men

The Englewood United Methodist Men leadership team met January 21 to review the year-end financial report and consider a budget for 2021.

We ended the year 2020 with peanut sales totaling \$79,269. This is 14% less than the average of the preceding three years' sales. Because we have been operating with three peanut cooking crews instead of the normal five crews, we were surprised that the 2020 sales total was this close to the three year average. It should be remembered that the price increase placed in effect in mid 2019 helped.

We contributed to the local non-profit agencies as shown below:

Among the disruptive challenges posed for all of us during 2020, we experienced some problems with supply and shipment of jars and lids but were able to overcome and carry on. Cooking crew members followed the mask wearing regiment carefully.

We adopted a budget for 2021 that assumes peanut sales based on three cooking crews. We are projecting sales and expenditures that are similar to our actual experience for 2020.

We concluded that we would continue the suspension of our monthly meetings until September. We pray that we will be able to resume monthly meetings for September, October, and November concluding the year with Ladies Night on December 5, 2021. We are hoping that we will see the return of two additional cooking crews to help us meet the 2021 Christmas season demand for our ever popular, very reasonably priced, delicious, nationally renowned, and widely acclaimed peanuts.

The leadership team very much appreciates the contribution of time and labor of the men of the church in support of the peanut production ministry, the support of our church members and staff, and that of the community.





FAITH CHRISTIAN MINISTRIES OF NASH COUNTY - MARCH NEEDS


SOUPER BOWL OF CARING 2021

What a great time we had this year completing our Souper Bowl of Caring. I'm sure you all know the end results but I'm gonna recap anyway because I'm so proud of how this congregation got behind this year's Outreach mission to purchase 3 bullet and stab resistant vests for the Nash County Sheriff's Office K9 program. I heard so many, many positive comments about where our money was going. We reached our goal

before that end of the SBC but **YOU** kept on giving!! It is fantastic to be able to purchase 3 protective vests for the newest K9deputies, Maya, Sneak, and Kieser at a cost of \$2,880 and then donate the remaining \$1,774.95 to their special K9 fund which will be used solely for future K9 needs. I hope you all enjoyed meeting two of the K9 deputies, Sgt. Ricks and K9 Pebbles and Deputy Mooring and K9 Kieser during our Sunday services. Some of us even got to pet the K9s!!! The men and women in the NCSO along with the K9 deputies put in long hours serving and protecting this community which has been made more difficult for them during this pandemic. The vests that we will purchase are made in the USA with NIJ certified ballistic panels so that they are certified body armor. Each vest will have *Gifted by Englewood United Methodist Church* embroidered on them. Purchasing these vests to protect the K9s plus the extra fund donation helps show the men and women of the NCSO how much we appreciate and value what they do for us 24/7. I'm sure Kieser, Maya, and Sneak, if they could, would say **THANK YOU** for your support as their human counterparts have done.


