SOUL PURPOSE - NOVEMBER 2021

"Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!" Those now-famous words of then President Ronald Reagan continues to reverberate in the minds of many of us that remember that famous speech delivered to the people of West Berlin.

I was reminded of this as my eyes became focused on the small piece of the Berlin Wall that sits on my desk. Given to me by a friend with government ties and was present when the wall collapsed, was given with these words: "We should be better at building bridges than walls."

On November 9, 1989, the world watched the fall of the Berlin Wall. I remember watching the frenzy as people around the world were filled with jubilation. Families were reunited. West Berliners greeted East Berliners with glasses of champagne as they crossed the border, many for the first time. Strangers embraced in excitement as people were filled with joy as their emotions were overwhelmed by the delight of what they were witnessing.

As I slowly rolled this treasured piece of history in my hand I squeezed it a bit

tighter when I found the words of Jesus taking root in my mind: "Every kingdom divided against itself is headed for destruction, and no city or house divided against itself will stand."

Jesus was consistent when addressing his followers on the importance of bridging ways in which to tear down walls of division, yet so many, even Christians, continue to clutch and encourage divisive behavior. To flame the emotions of our friends and neighbors is one of the unhealthiest things we can be a part of. It's not who we are created by God to be.

As siblings in Christ, we are called to seek out ways to erase brokenness and embrace dialogue that brings all of God's children around tables of fellowship and in seeking to live out our mission of, "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World." To witness our world seeking ways in which to offer powerful displays

of love for Christ and neighbor would give each of us an added prayer to offer around our Thanksgiving tables later this month.

Catholic Cardinal, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, who we now know as Pope Francis, was once asked why he chose Saint Francis of Assisi as his model in choosing a name as Pontif. His Holiness said Francis of Assisi was: "...the man of peace, the man who loves and protects creation." He later added: "In every religion there is always an

integralist group that does not want to move ahead and lives from bitter memories, past conflicts, and seeks even more war and sows fear. We have seen that it is more beautiful to sow hope, to go forward always holding hands."

The gift of peace and fellowship cannot be created in a petri dish. It only comes to us through honesty, integrity, and open conversations grounded in love.

As you approach Thanksgiving and this season of sharing our blessings, please remember the words my friend, Chester, offered me many years ago: "We should

be better at building bridges than walls." Then, prayerfully offer this appeal, "God, tear down these walls and to us, we plead, that You bring peace and that any walls dividing the Body of Christ be torn down and be replaced with bridges."

Congregations for Children Community Connectivity Mini-Grants Awarded

The NCCUMC Congregations for Children Committee is pleased to announce that five churches in our conference have been awarded C4C Community Connectivity Mini-Grants. The funds were made possible by a \$5000 grant to C4C from the NCCUMC Board of Church and Society to encourage and support churches' advocacy efforts for local public schools.

The purpose of the mini-grants was to help fund initiatives seeking to enhance weekday after-school hours programming intended to address the learning gap exacerbated by online and hybrid in-person/online learning for our public school students during the Covid pandemic. While all twelve applicants demonstrated a strong commitment to the mission of Congregations for Children partnerships, five stood out as being particularly worthy of the financial support that this grant offers. 

EUMC is excited to partner with Peacemakers for their upcoming Christmas toy store project. Peacemakers is a Christian community development organization serving the under-resourced area of South Rocky Mount. Their mission is to empower members of the community with the knowledge and skills necessary to lead successful and sustainable lives.

The Peacemakers Toy Store will operate Friday, December 3rd and Saturday, December 4th at their 2221 West Raleigh Blvd. location. For this outreach, local churches, organizations, and individuals donate new, unwrapped toys to Peacemakers, with price tags still attached. Peacemakers then reprice the items at 80 percent off.

Invitations are sent to local low-income families (based on school social worker and local agency referrals), and those families come to the "store" to shop on the designated days. There are also free wrapping stations so parents can wrap the gifts they have purchased. As a result, parents leave with presents for their children that they have carefully selected, purchased, and wrapped. Through this model, parents are empowered and the small amount of revenue that is produced through the store goes directly back into other Peacemakers programming.

If you would like to help with this project, please bring **new unwrapped toys** with price tags attached to the church from Sunday, October 31st through Sunday, November 28, 2021. 
