

Memorial and Honorarium cards will be available on the table outside the church office for you to send to friends and loved ones to let them know of your contribution in their name.

The deadline for placing your order is December 11<sup>th</sup>. A special bulletin listing the donors and recipients will be available at the Christmas Eve Service. All donations are tax deductible and all proceeds go directly to the Armenian Cattle Project.

#### **TRUSTEES CORNER!**

Because of a gracious memorial and donations, the Trustees' majority, voted yes to be able to update and improve our sanctuary, fellowship hall audio, and our streaming capabilities on Facebook and our website. Through the research of Rob Buckner and Bill Dove, we have contacted REDFISH Music, and their most experienced representative visited our church and explained to our Trustees in attendance, along with our ministers, and church representatives the improvements and more up to date changes that will enhance our worship and activities held at our church. Our streaming improvements will certainly make our worship audio and visual explanation of the streaming improvements will certainly make our worship audio and visual

capacities clearer and more accessible to those who are unable to attend.

Changes to our existing systems will allow us to have two monitors at the front of our sanctuary and two that will serve the congregation seated in the rear of the sanctuary, thus, removing the screen. We will also have a new laptop to allow us to give a clearer worship presentation online and also be able to have a service streamed from the Sanctuary to our fellowship hall. Because of these improvements, we will be able to remove the cord that is currently being taped to the floor, making it safer for members.

If there are no problems with obtaining the equipment needed and the schedule of REDFISH is open, we will hope to begin immediately. We will keep you posted on all the progress and if you have questions, please contact Nathan, Savanna, Barbara or Christian. Expanding our witness and outreach is a very positive goal of our church! We are excited to increase our footprint for Christ in our community.

#### PEACEMAKERS CHRISTMAS TOY STORE


The Peacemaker Christmas Toy Store will be held on Friday, December 1<sup>st</sup> and Saturday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> this year.
