Why I'm a UMC Pastor

Imagine my surprise as I stumbled across a certain article displaying my picture as if it were a Wanted Poster, as I reviewed this copy of our newsletter. Where I enjoy my share of attention, having it drawn directly on me is not my norm. It's humbling and I'm grateful, but also a bit embarrassed by the attention. (Thanks staff).

However, I'm not embarrassed to be a pastor in the United Methodist Church.

I've not always been a United Methodist. I wasn't born a United Methodist like so many of you. I chose the United Methodist Church before it chose me.

Jane and I, like so many young couples, were church shopping, looking for the local congregation with the most active youth and children's program. And so, we were immediately *connected* to Hertford United Methodist Church in Hertford, NC. Jane's position as Editor of the local newspaper had relocated us and we were

wanting to be as engaged as we could. I had no idea that our being active in the congregation would lead me into pastoral ministry, though I'd felt the call since I was a child.

As I began to read about what life in the United Methodist connection would entail, I was immediately drawn to the Social Principles of our Church and the freedom to express my beliefs on issues surrounding social justice, racial equity, and the importance of women in leadership, ministry, and mission. As I picked up on stories about Anglican Priest, John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, my passionate love for God and neighbor grew alongside my base of knowledge. Wesley's witness surrounding diversity and his teachings on Christianity were essentially about love for God and neighbor, growing through the 'means of grace', and staying connected even when people agree to disagree.

I listened to the stories about Wesley's Quadrilateral, and the process of theological reflection using, primarily the Holy Scriptures, but also looking faithfully through tradition, reason, and experience.

And I found a new peace as I continuously grew in knowledge

about God's love and grace; a love and grace that would allow me, yes, even a sinner like me, to live out my calling as a United Methodist pastor. The lessons I embraced through The United Methodist Church allowed me to reflect on how we live our lives with special and unique types of grace: prevenient grace, which is God's active presence in people's lives before they even sense the divine at work in their lives; justifying grace, through which all sins are forgiven by God; and sanctifying grace, which allows people to grow in their ability to live like Jesus.

And, frankly, I'm still learning. I learn through my mistakes, I learn listening to

my colleagues, and I learn from observing you, my friends and church family.

And so, as we celebrate October as Pastor Appreciation Month, as your pastor, I covet your prayers. Pray that when I struggle to make choices for our church, that I do so with a heart of love and a soul filled with passion. I love God, I love neighbor, and I love The United Methodist Church. It's not only who I am, but it's who God has called me to be.

Wesley, on the other hand, had a hic-up in his life. He developed an intestinal torsion that required surgery and while under care for this problem, it was discovered he also has an autoimmune disorder which unfortunately has disqualified him to be a service dog. But, he survived his surgery. Wesley is doing well and has been adopted by one of the employees at Canines for Service and is living a good life. Just to show

that God has a hand in what we are doing; Wesley has been replaced by Tabitha's sibling, Murphy. Please know that the route by which Murphy was obtained would never have happened had we not sponsored Tabitha. So we still have two dogs. Everything donated for Wesley will now go to Murphy. Both Tabitha and Murphy are in Phase 2 of the training and if everything continues to go well, they should be placed with a veteran next spring. The picture below is of Tabitha (left) and Murphy (right) at their 1 year birthday party. Look at those hats and their dear faces.


Our volunteers are very special thoughtful church members graciously sharing kind words to members and loved ones. Thank you for your faithfulness as we grow this mission!
