### **Consecration Sunday Is Coming!**



October is our month to focus on stewardship. I know! Conversations around money can make us a bit uncomfortable, but we won't grow in our image of God and generosity if we avoid them. Once again we will be using Consecration Sunday as a resource for our stewardship. At its core is a biblical perspective of money and giving that does not center on merely paying the bills. Rather, we view our financial contributions as a marker for how we are growing spiritually and in our relationship with God through the support of the church's mission and ministry. The Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program is a great way to teach these biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship.

Consecration Sunday is based on the philosophy that the giver gives for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Have you ever thought of your growth in generosity as a marker of your growth in faith? Wherever we have begun this journey, wherever we are now, the goal is to be like the one we follow, Jesus Christ, who unselfishly gave everything on the cross. When Consecration Sunday arrives the question will be asked, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" We answer that question based on a desire to grow more and more into the image of the Christ who sent us.

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's mission and ministries of nurture, outreach, and witness. Everyone who attends has the opportunity to fill out an Estimate of Giving Card if they feel the Spirit's urging. Even if you don't plan to fill one out, come anyway. There will be a great speaker in worship that morning and a wonderful lunch to follow. Who knows how the Spirit might work in worship that day? Our guest leader, Rev. Alan Felton, will be there to walk us through the whole process if you feel so called to make that covenant between you and God.

During the month of October, we will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events with the help of our wonderful Consecration Sunday team and church leadership. I know that they will take every opportunity to inform, inspire, and invite everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Consecration Sunday is on October 29<sup>th</sup> and I cannot wait to celebrate with you as we see the way God is at work here at Englewood UMC!

The Englewood United Women in Faith will be cooking their fabulous Brunswick Stew on Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup>!





The loss of churches through disaffiliation (308 in our North Carolina Conference) has generated concern over what the United Methodist Church will look like after the General Conference that will be held in 2024. We will view a video recording of a portion of Reverend Hamilton's presentation.

So mark your calendar for October 3rd at 6:00 p.m. We will have a meal prepared by one of our members very reasonably priced at \$5.00 (free for first time visitors). See you then!



#### PILGRIMAGE: NOVEMBER 10-12





#### ATTENTION ALL PRAYER WARRIORS



Consecration Sunday will be held on October 29<sup>th</sup> (see Pastor's article for more details). Consecration means to make holy or to dedicate to a higher purpose. And each year we gather to consecrate our gifts of our time, talents and financial resources for the coming year.

In the spirit of our renewed faith and witness through our personal calling to give, we need EVERYONE to consciously, intentionally and regularly pray throughout this stewardship season.

We ask you to pray for renewed hope, renewed commitment and renewed energy for the fullness of our personal journey of faith and witness. In the time leading up to this special Sunday we pray that we will be encouraged to seek God's wisdom of

our time and financial resources. Giving should come not from guilt or compulsion, rather, it should stir a personal feeling of joy knowing that no matter what we consecrate to His higher purpose it will be blessed and multiplied by our Heavenly Father.

To help guide us in our spiritual journey and prayers through this month, here are a few passages on which to reflect and a prayer that, in addition to your personal words of prayer, may help uplift and glorify our stewardship journey together.

#### Exodus 25:2 – Giving with a willing heart.

<sup>2</sup> "Speak to the people of Israel, that they take for me an offering; from every man whose heart makes him willing you shall receive the offering for me."

#### 1 Chronicles 29:1-4 – Giving back to God what God has given to us.

¹And David the king said to all the assembly, "Solomon my son, whom alone God has chosen, is young and inexperienced, and the work is great; for the palace will not be for man but for the LORD God. ²So I have provided for the house of my God, so far as I was able, the gold for the things of gold, the silver for the things of silver, and the bronze for the things of bronze, the iron for the things of iron, and wood for the things of wood, besides great quantities of onyx and stones for setting, antimony, colored stones, all sorts of precious stones, and marble. ³Moreover, in addition to all that I have provided for the holy house, I have a treasure of my own of gold and silver, and because of my devotion to the house of my God I give it to the house of my God: ⁴three thousand talents of gold, of the gold of Ophir, and seven thousand talents of refined silver, for overlaying the walls of the house.

#### Psalm 37:21, 26 – Giving generously.

<sup>21</sup>The wicked borrows, and cannot pay back, but the righteous is generous and gives; <sup>26</sup>He is ever giving liberally and lending, and his children become a blessing.

#### "Gracious God,

We come before you with humble hearts, seeking to grow in generosity, just as you have shown us your boundless love and grace. Fill us with your Spirit, that we may see the opportunities to give and serve others in our daily lives. Teach us to be cheerful givers, not seeking recognition or praise, but giving from a heart overflowing with love for you and our fellow human beings.
