The Women of the Way Circle invites everyone to donate paper towels, toilet paper, tissues, etc. to The Lighthouse. They are also



EUMC Book Club

Our EUMC Book Club will meet again on Monday, September 27th at 7:00 p.m. to discuss our next reading selection, *Broken Signposts: How Christianity Makes Sense of the World* by N. T. Wright. Wright is one of today's leading Bible scholars, particularly in the study of the New Testament. In this book he uses the Gospel of John to reveal how Christianity presents a compelling and relevant explanation for our world. Wright argues that every world view must explain seven "signposts", indicators inherent to humanity: Justice, Spirituality, Relationships, Beauty, Freedom, Truth, and Power. Using the Gospel of John as his source, he shows how Christianity defines each signpost and illuminates why we so often see them as being "broken" and unattainable. Drawing on the wisdom of the Gospels, Wright explains why these signposts are fractured and damaged and how Christianity provides the vision, guidance, and hope for making them whole once again, ultimately healing ourselves and our world.

There are three copies of each of our books for 2021 in the church library on the UMW shelf. Feel free to check them out to read and return them when finished. You can also purchase your own copy (the books are all available on Amazon).

Everyone is welcome to participate! We will gather in the Church Parlor.



After-School Bears Program

We are excited to welcome back our After-School Bears Program starting on September 2nd! The Bears Program meets on Thursday afternoons for a group of ten students from Englewood Elementary School. We have a snack, homework help time, a Bible lesson, and other activities. We have 10 very excited children signed up for this school year, and we just need YOU!!



If you would be able to help as a volunteer for any of the following, please let Savanna know. We'd love to have your help!

- Snack Time (3:15 p.m.-3:45 p.m.) Prepare a snack for the children to enjoy when they get here after school.
- Helping a child with homework (4:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m.) We like to match one student with one volunteer so that you're able to develop a relationship, which means we need 10 homework helpers total. You don't need special skills or knowledge, just a heart that's open to the children.
- Assisting with the pick-up time (5:00 p.m.-5:45 p.m.) Help make sure each child gets signed out by an approved adult.

PLAY AREA PLAN

About two years ago, the Board of Trustees began exploring the idea of using the open space courtyard area as a play area for children and youth. Because this area is enclosed by the fellowship hall, the children's education wing, and the adult education wing, it is safe and easily accessible from both the fellowship all and children's hall.

A Play Area Study Committee composed of Lee Pullen, Barbara Batts, Savanna Becker and Peter Varney has looked at play areas at schools, City parks, and other churches in the area. The committee has reviewed plans for our courtyard area prepared by landscape architects and, through this process, has refined its vision for our church based on visits to various outdoor activity and learning environments, consultations with experts in the field, and prayerful consideration of our church's needs and hopes for future growth.

Through Savanna's leadership, we are experiencing growth in the number of children and youth participating in church activity. In addition, we are resuming the Bears Club with students from Englewood School and the Twin County Autism Family Support Group. Developing a play area in the courtyard may also attract other families with children to our church.

The Board of Trustees has engaged registered landscape architect Tom Moss of Nash County to draft a plan for the courtyard area. Tom has experience designing playground areas for other churches and schools in the area and has impressed our planning team with a vision that is specifically for our church.

According to the draft plan, the area nearest the children's education wing would largely be an open space grassy area with three benches placed in circular hardscape surfaces. In the center are three graduated wooden decks with the upper level covered with a shade structure. The existing shrubbery in this area would be replaced with all new plantings. The existing dogwood tree would remain. It is envisioned that this space would be used by older youth and adults for outside assembly and activity, as well as being an open play space for children. We view this space as flexible for use by any age group!





The area nearest the covered walkway connecting the fellowship hall to the adult education wing would be used primarily by young children. In the center of this area is a hard surface patio that would be covered by a shade structure. The plan shows a circular concrete tricycle and walking pathway connected to the existing covered walkway along the fellowship hall wall. The plan also shows two small wooden playhouses. In this area, the existing shrubbery would be removed and replaced with new plantings. The existing dogwood tree would remain.

The total estimated cost of the project is approximately \$50,000. The study committee has detailed estimates and is hopeful that individuals and groups will contribute to the Play Area Fund.

The Board of Trustees has detailed drawings and would be glad to present these to Sunday School classes, United Methodist Men, United Methodist Women, and any others who are interested.

The Trustees intend to retain the existing playground area situated near the church kitchen. This area would serve as a dedicated active play space for our children. In contrast with the flexible open space concept in the courtyard area, this space is intended for physical activity and "getting the wiggles out". This area has been cleaned up and is currently being used by our Children's Ministry but more work is needed to make it more attractive.

We are excited to present this joyful addition to our ministry and we look forward to congregational participation in this mission for children, youth, adults, and all of our church family!

We continue praying for all who bring healing and wholeness to our world, those who give care to the sick, and those affected by COVID-19.


Children's Sunday School


Youth Yard Sale

Safe Sanctuaries Training

Our church has such a heart for young people, and one of the many ways we show what a priority youth and children have in our church is by following a set of Safe Sanctuaries guidelines. These guidelines are in place to make sure our

church is a safe place for everyone, especially the most vulnerable among us—I know that's something we ALL care about!

We will be having a Safe Sanctuaries training within the next few weeks in the Fellowship Hall. This one-hour training, along with a background check, is required for all adults who work with our youth and children. However, we encourage EVERYONE in the church to participate in this training. Even if you don't volunteer in our youth and children's ministries, you are still part of these children's lives. What an awesome statement we would make about the priority we put on our young people in this church if we could say that the whole church has been Safe Sanctuaries trained!!

These guidelines are not because we don't trust anyone, but because we realize the safety of our children is too important to risk falling through the cracks. We hope to see you at our training!
